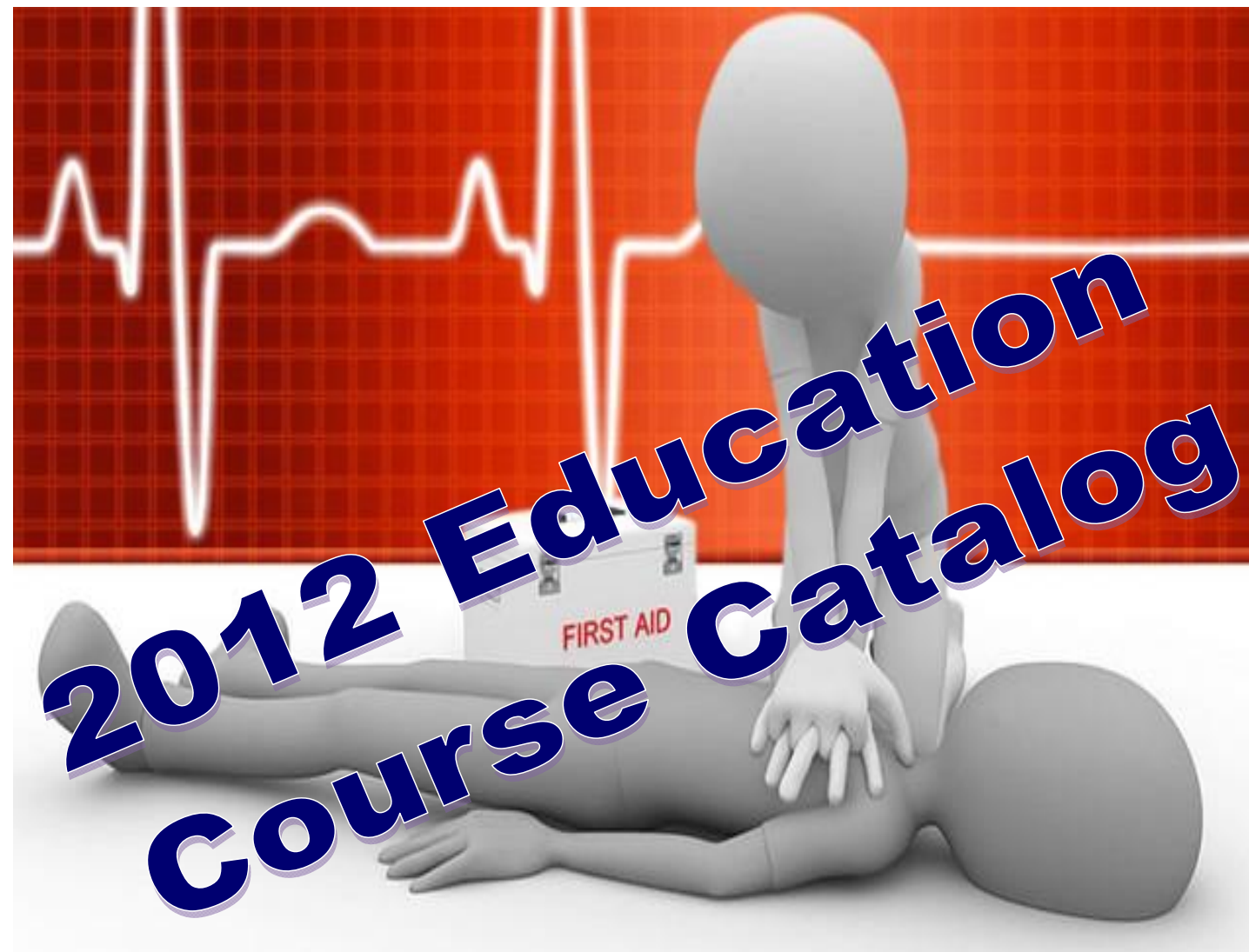

AMLS Provider Course

Course Description:

The AMLS course is sponsored by the National Association of EMTs (NAEMT) and endorsed by the National Association of EMS Physicians (NAEMSP). It addresses the most common medical complaints and offers a "think outside the box" method of assessing and managing patients in medical crises.

Using the scene size-up, history and physical exam, participants learn to systematically rule-out and rule-in possibilities and probabilities of medical problems. This course offers an assessment-based approach and then progresses to a diagnostic-based approach to developing treatment plans, resulting in a differential diagnosis.

Course structure:

AMLS is a sixteen (16) hour, two-day program that consists of interactive lectures, teaching and evaluation stations.

The interactive/case-based lectures include these topics:

- Patient assessment
- Airway management
- Assessment of the shock patient
- Dyspnea/respiratory failure
- Chest pain
- Altered mental status
- Abdominal pain

Successful completion of the course requires:

- Attendance on both days
- Proficiency in the 4 evaluation stations:
 - Hypoperfusion
 - Dyspnea/respiratory failure
 - Chest pain
 - Abdominal/GI bleed
- A score of 74% or better on a written exam

Students who successfully complete the AMLS course will receive a certificate of completion that is valid for four years.

ACLS Provider Course

Course Description:

The American Heart Association's Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support course is totally redesigned for healthcare providers who either direct or participate in the resuscitation of a patient, whether in or out of hospital. Through the ACLS course, providers will enhance their skills in the treatment of the adult victim of a cardiac arrest or other cardiopulmonary emergencies. ACLS emphasizes the importance of basic life support CPR to patient survival; the integration of effective basic life support with advanced cardiovascular life support interventions; and the importance of effective team interaction and communication during resuscitation.

ACLS is based on simulated clinical scenarios that encourage active, hands-on participation through learning stations where students will practice essential skills individually, as part of a team, and as team leader. Realistic simulations reinforce the following key concepts: proficiency in basic life support care; recognizing and initiating early management of peri-arrest conditions; managing cardiac arrest; identifying and treating ischemic chest pain and acute coronary syndromes; recognizing other life-threatening clinical situations (such as stroke) and providing initial care; ACLS algorithms; and effective resuscitation team dynamics.

The one day disciplined specific ACLS Instructor Course utilizes small group learning stations to review current concepts of teaching cardiovascular care. In the learning stations participants will review essential skills and ACLS concepts, receive instruction on ACLS equipment use, and practice teaching a case presentation. Participants will also receive training in American Heart Association expectations for instructors. As per the 2010 American Heart Association guideline changes, the Instructor course is now comprised of two separate components. These components include the Core Instructor Course and a Discipline Specific Module.

After successful completion of classroom instruction the Candidate must be monitored within ninety (90) days teaching a Provider or Renewal course BEFORE an Instructor card can be issued. Course recognition is for 2 years from the date of completion of the classroom portion of the course.

Community First Aid Course

Course Description:

The Heartsaver First Aid Course teaches rescuers to effectively recognize and treat adult emergencies in the critical first minutes until emergency medical services personnel arrive. The course also provides a complete health and safety training solution for first aid, adult and pediatric CPR with AED when combined with the Community CPR Course.

At the conclusion of this course, participants should be able to:

1. Describe the principles of providing first aid
2. Describe how the first aid rescuer protects himself/herself and others
3. Describe how to assess a victim
4. Describe what to do after the emergency

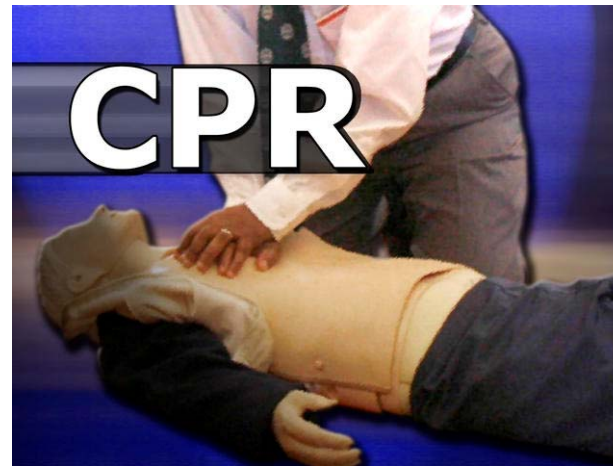

CPR Courses—Community

Course Description:

Heartsaver CPR:

The Heartsaver CPR Course is designed to teach CPR and relief of foreign-body airway obstruction (FBAO) to all lay rescuers, particularly those who are expected to respond to emergencies in the workplace. Participants include security guards, firefighters, police, and other lay responders. Although the course may be used to teach CPR to all lay rescuers, it is specifically designed for lay rescuers who are required to obtain a course completion card -a credential- documenting completion of a CPR course. All rescuers are trained in CPR and relief of FBAO.

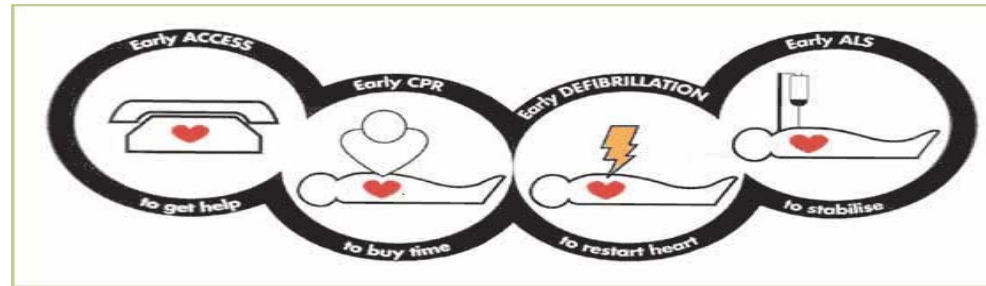
CPR Courses—Healthcare

Course Description:

The BLS Healthcare Provider Course teaches CPR skills for helping victims of all ages (including providing ventilation with a barrier device, a bag-mask device, and oxygen); use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED); and relief of foreign-body airway obstruction (FBAO). One and two-rescuer CPR skills are taught. It's intended for participants who provide health care to patients in a wide variety of settings, including in-hospital and out-of-hospital. For certified or non-certified, licensed or non-licensed healthcare professionals.

A written and skills exam must be successfully completed to receive certification.

Student will receive a Healthcare Provider CPR Book and course materials as well as a pocket CPR mask.

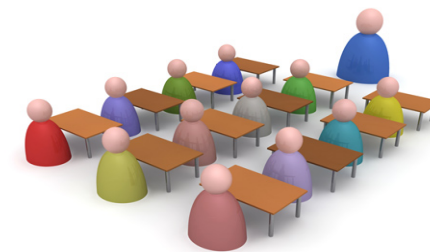

The ITLS Advanced course builds on this knowledge, emphasizing evaluation steps and sequencing as well as techniques for resuscitating and packaging patients. ITLS Advanced is appropriate for advanced EMTs, paramedics, trauma nurses, physicians and other advanced EMS personnel. Hands-on stations include:

- Patient assessment and management
- Basic and advanced airway management
- Needle chest decompression and fluid resuscitation
- Spinal motion restriction — rapid extrication, short back board, helmet management, log roll, and long back board/ scoop stretcher utilization
- Extremity immobilization and traction splint application

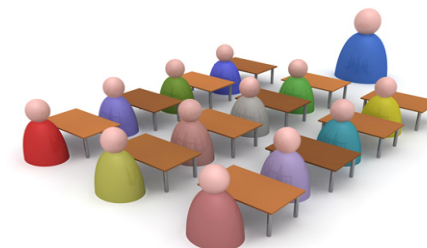

PALS Provider Course

Course Description:

The American Heart Association Pediatric Advanced Life Support course is based on science evidence from the *2010 AHA Guidelines for CPR and ECC*. The goal of the PALS course is to aid the pediatric healthcare provider in developing the knowledge and skills necessary to efficiently and effectively manage critically ill infants and children, resulting in improved outcomes. Skills taught include recognition and treatment of infants and children at risk for cardiopulmonary arrest; the systematic approach to pediatric assessment; effective respiratory management; defibrillation and synchronized cardioversion; intraosseous access and fluid bolus administration; and effective resuscitation team dynamics.

This course will prepare the student to instruct the American Heart Association PALS Course. The PALS Course is an Pediatric Advanced Life Support course is based on science evidence from the *2010 AHA Guidelines for CPR and ECC*. The goal of the PALS course is to aid the pediatric healthcare provider in developing the knowledge and skills necessary to efficiently and effectively manage critically ill infants and children, resulting in improved outcomes. Skills taught include recognition and treatment of infants and children at risk for cardiopulmonary arrest; the systematic approach to pediatric assessment; effective respiratory management; defibrillation and synchronized cardioversion; intraosseous access and fluid bolus administration; and effective resuscitation team dynamics.

After successful completion of classroom instruction the Candidate must be monitored within ninety (90) days teaching a Provider or Renewal course BEFORE an Instructor card can be issued. Course recognition is for 2 years from the date of completion of the classroom portion of the course

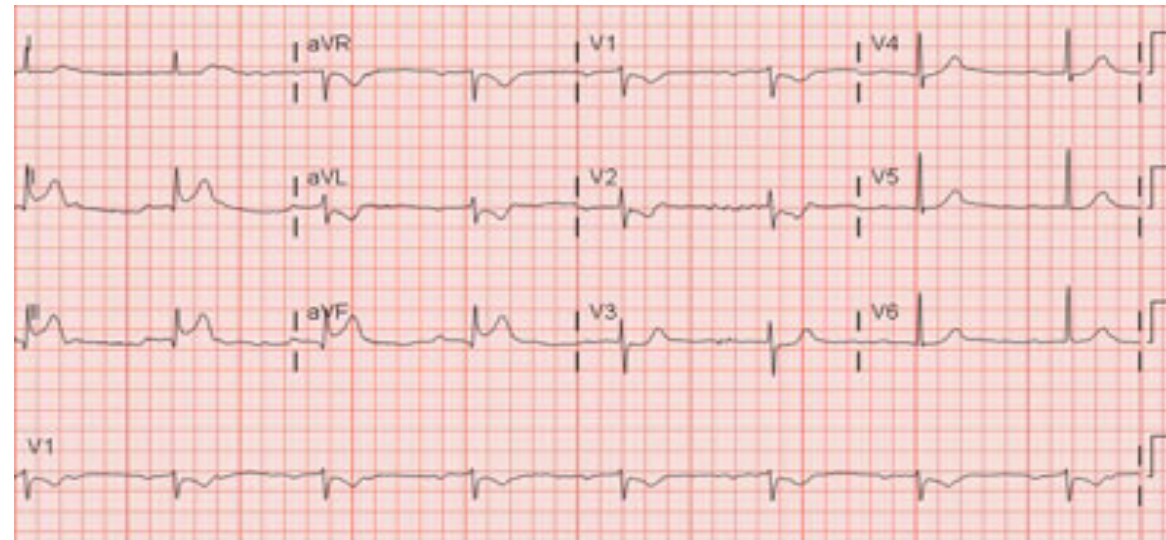
Navigating through the ECG

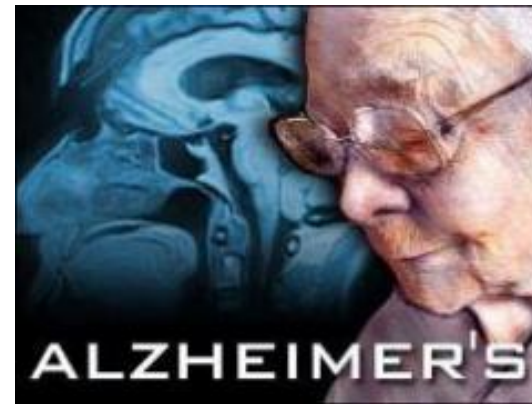
